

Professor Tomasz Zylicz – Faculty of Economic Sciences, University of Warsaw (UW)

Graduated from the Economics (1974) and Mathematics (1977) Departments in UW. Since 1974 has worked at UW. In 1978/1979 carried out an additional study of economics and mathematics at the University of Wisconsin in Madison. In 1988/89 worked in the Institute of Behavioral Sciences at the University of Colorado in Boulder as a Fulbright Visiting Fellow. In 1992/93 worked in the Swedish Royal Academy of Sciences in Stockholm as a visiting professor.

In 1989-91 worked full-time in the Polish Ministry of Environment. As the Economics Director, he was responsible for the state environmental budget and served as a co-author of a major environmental policy reform. In 1993 received the "Pew Scholar Award in Conservation and the Environment". He used the award to create the Warsaw Ecological Economics Center at UW. The Center carries out research on economic aspects of environmental protection as well as hosts fellowships for young scholars.

Authored many academic papers including articles in *Environmental and Resource Economics* and *Ecological Economics*. The book *Costing Nature in a Transition Economy. Case Studies in Poland* (Elgar; Cheltenham, UK, Northampton, MA, USA 2000) summarises many of the research projects carried out at the Warsaw Ecological Economics Center. More recent research interests are summarized in the book *The Economics of International Cooperation* (Peter Lang; Frankfurt, 2015).
